

Killed in action on 8<sup>th</sup> June 1940. No known grave, Plymouth Naval Memorial. At the beginning of the <u>Second World War</u> in September 1939, the ship escorted <u>aircraft carriers</u> before she was transferred to the <u>Western Approaches</u> for convoy escort duties that last until April 1940 when the Germans <u>invaded Norway</u>. That month *Ardent* was transferred to the <u>Home Fleet</u> and supported <u>Allied</u> operations in Norway. Whilst escorting the carrier <u>Glorious</u>, she was sunk by the battleships *Scharnhorst* and *Gneisenau* on 8 June 1940.
