Entrants are being asked to submit photos that represent the town and the month in which they are taken.

Each month, three finalists will be selected from the photos received and a winner will be chosen by public vote via the Town Council's social media channels.

The winner of each





month's competition will be displayed as part of a 'Keynsham Through the Year' exhibition at the Railway Station at the beginning of 2020.

The inaugural competition in January was won by Mike Vigliucci's, 'Somer Children', a lovely photo of his three children walking along the Somerdale Road on a misty winter morning. February's winner, Paul Tompkins, took advantage of the cold snap for his photo 'Priory Blizzard' which captures a snow covered Priory Road in the middle of a wintry shower.

The competition is open to anybody so if you would like

to take part, whether you're a seasoned photography professional or just like to take a few snaps on your phone, then we really would like to see your images.



Paintings of Bath & Morocco aintings by current

Keynsham resident, James F Lynch, are the focus of an exhibition at the Victoria Art Gallery in Bath until the end of March.

Lynch studied at Camberwell and Goldsmiths in London in the 1960s, sharing a flat with acclaimed British artist, Howard Hodgkin. While other British





artists were congregating in Cornwall and forming the St. Ives Group, Lynch was holidaying in Italy. His first taste of North Africa came when he took a ferry from Sicily to Tunisia, subsequently visiting Morocco and discovering the port of Larache. Lynch became enamoured with the town: he visited more and more frequently before living there over a period of four decades. James painted the streets, cafés and people in Larache, making preliminary visual notes on canvas which were then worked-up and finished in the studio. On his return to the UK, James setup a studio in his flat in Bath, overlooking the Holburne Museum and painted images of the city.

After a long career as an artist and teacher Lynch, now 86, recently moved into the St Monica Trust Charterhouse nursing care home in The Chocolate Quarter on the site of the old Fry's chocolate factory in Keynsham.

Joe Tymkov, The Chocolate Quarter's artist-in-residence, who has helped to organise the exhibition, described Lynch's distinctive style and way of working: "A still life



of his I saw recently had a touch of Cezanne about it with regard to his handling and application of paint. I had the privilege of watching James painting recently. It was fascinating to see him pick up three colours on his brush, which he briefly mixed on the palette and then further mixed on the canvas, turning his brush in order to emphasise one colour over another".

Lynch's work has been exhibited at the Royal Scottish Academy, the Royal West of England Academy, the New English Art Club, The Walker Art Gallery in Liverpool and the Alexandra Irigoyan Gallery in Madrid. He has had many solo exhibitions, for instance at the Rooksmoor Gallery in Bath, the Angel


Gallery in Lavenham, and the Annexe Provinciale de la Culture, Larache, Morocco. This impressive list of intercontinental locations is testament to the esteem in which the artist's work is held.


The James Lynch, Paintings of Bath & Morocco, will be on display at the Victoria Art Gallery in Bath until March 31st. Entry is FREE.

The images were supplied by the Keynsham Photowalkers; a wellbeing group setup in 2018, which encourages members to get outside and challenge their pre-existing view of the town by going on 'Photohunts'.


Members go out in search of photographs based on set criteria e.g. 'a repeating pattern' or 'something pink'.

The collection includes some of Keynsham's most iconic landmarks including St. John the Baptist Church, the Civic Centre, Albert Mill and the Chocolate Factory, as well as some brilliant images of local wildlife and countryside. The display will be up until April, when the posters will be replaced with a new exhibition featuring photos from Keynsham's past.

Bath Fringe is an annual festival of all the arts, taking place in and around the city of Bath. This year it runs for 17 days from Friday 24th May to Sunday 9th June.

The festival is one of the oldest and largest Fringes in Britain. It has been running as an independent event since 1982 and this year it will celebrate the 50th anniversary of the first of a series of festivals started by Bath Arts Workshop which it considers to be its inspirational ancestors.

The majority of the acts (150+) that take part are self-produced or supported by their venues.



The programme will appear online in mid-April and in print by the beginning of May.

The FAB Fringe Arts Bath, A Visual Arts festival, runs concurrently and in collaboration with the main Fringe Festival.
