



Keynsham Music Festival Cancelled

The third biggest, free music event in the UK has been cancelled for the first time in its twenty-four year history but will return in 2021

ver the past several weeks, our world has been turned upside down by the global coronavirus pandemic. Our hearts are with everyone impacted by it.

It is with deep sadness that, the Trustees of

Keynsham Music Festival, have decided not to stage the 2020 festival. This difficult decision has been made in light of the current situation that we all face and feel together.

Like many around the world, we are doing our best to quickly adjust to these complex times.

Our volunteers have been working since last November to organise what was going to be our biggest, most diverse and most exciting festival ever.

Every one of our suppliers
has offered to carry
over our deposits
and current



contracts until next year, for which we are very grateful.

All trader deposits will be fully refunded in the coming days. All artists, performers, acts, and traders will be rebooked for the festival in 2021.

All of the people who work in the industry, upon which the festival relies so much, now find themselves in a very difficult and unknown future. We send our heartfelt best wishes to all of them

Please note that next vear's festival week will take place from 28th June - 4th July 2021.

We will continue to monitor the situation and hope that we will be able to put on a special community event later in the year. Of course, the timing of the event will depend on the health of the nation. Keep an eye on social media and our website for updates.

In light of the isolation measures and the very sad news that the 2020 Keynsham Music Festival has been cancelled, organiser Tom Youdan and his friends floated the idea of a virtual festival to reach out to those in the community feeling isolated, or just in

out live to hundreds of people locally and across the UK, Italy and as far away as Australia!

Drawstring bag appeal

Reynsham in Bloom, in conjunction with the Keynsham Coronavirus COVID-19 Support Group, is running a project collecting items and asking people to make drawstring bags to get essential supplies to the health professionals at our local hospitals.

Keynsham Music Man

The Keynsham Mencap project continues to grow, providing a platform for members to express themselves through music



The Music Man Project run by Keynsham Mencap provides creative artists with a platform to raise awareness about the incredible difference music can make. Emotional well-being, basic skill development, self-discipline, teamwork, coordination, communication and social skills are all significantly enhanced through the study of music.

The project runs every Saturday morning and offers twenty member's two hours of teaching once a week, with singing and percussion as a regular feature of each session.

Membership has grown by 50% since launch. The sessions offer an opportunity for people with a learning disability to access a regular and inclusive music club, perform to the general public, learn a new skill, develop as individuals and be part of a solid team.

social skills are all significantly enhanced through the study of music

In April 2019 members joined in with other regional Music Man Project groups to perform together at the Royal Albert Hall. Over 200 musicians with a learning disability from across the UK took part, accompanied by the Loraine Kelly Orchestra and massed community choirs from Southend; with the help of special guests, Peter Egan, Classical Reflection and

Jonny Buxton. This was a huge opportunity for local people with a learning disability to access and perform in an iconic concert hall in the biggest celebration of accessible music making there has ever been. The musicians worked hard and attended extra rehearsals in preparation for the concert. The Music Man Project had been running for just over a year - the Albert Hall concert was exactly one year after it was launched!

The musicians have performed to family and friends, and the wider community, including at the charity's 40th birthday celebration, Christmas fundraiser concerts and a performance in the Keynsham Memorial Park.

With the humans out of the way, a collection of chalk drawn bears have moved into an estate in Keynsham

The bears are the work of Bilbie Green resident Ryan Wall, whose collection of famous furries forms part of a 'Bear Hunt' that was organised so that children would have something to look at on their daily exercise walks.

The idea was to give a bit of cheer and light relief to the children of the community

Residents were encouraged to put their drawings and teddy bears in their windows but Ryan, who has been at home during the lockdown looking after his two children, took things one step further; the Chartered Engineer has been drawing his favourite bears (plus a few rogue mammals) from books and TV.


Ryan explains: "the idea was to give a bit of cheer and

light relief to the children of the community as they walked and cycled around. People started putting their teddy bears in the windows, so the kids could go on a 'bear hunt'. I took this to the next progression by drawing some famous bears on the driveway"

Paddington was the first bear to be 'drawn' to the estate, followed by Winnie the Pooh and then Yogi. Though most of Ryan's drawings are famous bears there have been a few nonursine entries and he has had some pretty strange requests: "I've had requests for all sorts; superheroes, various children's cartoon characters and even Slash from Guns 'n' Roses"
