12. CLIMATE AND ECOLOGY BILL (Information documents distributed with the agenda)

Motion to Support the Climate and Ecological Emergency Bill. The CEE Bill Alliance has sent the following draft letter to Local Authorities seeking support.

Dear Chief Executive/Leader of the Council,

May I begin by congratulating your Council for declaring a climate emergency. This is the visionary effort that is needed to find best practices to prevent the planet from heating more than 1.5 degrees °C above pre-industrial levels.

The Climate and Ecological Emergency (CEE) Bill 1 is now before Parliament because we feel that net zero by 2050 is far too late and that the Government needs to listen to the direction that councils across the country are taking. I am writing to ask your Council to declare its support for the CEE Bill, which obliges the Government to develop a strategy with legal obligations to:

- · require that the UK takes its fair share of reducing CO2 emissions to ensure that global temperature does not rise above 1.5 degrees C.
- \cdot ensure that all the UK's entire carbon footprint (including the manufacture and transportation of goods from overseas) is accounted for and that we are taking full responsibility for our ecological footprint by protecting nature along supply chains.
- \cdot restore and regenerate the UK's depleted soils, wildlife habitats and species populations to healthy and robust states, and to maximise their capacity to absorb CO2 and optimise their resistance to climate heating.
- · set up an independent Citizen's Assembly, representative of the UK's population, to engage with Parliament and help develop the national strategy.

I attach a copy of the bill and a flyer on why this bill is essential. I hope your Council will be able to support the CEE Bill, and I look forward to hearing from you.

RECOMMENDED

- (i) Keynsham Town Council decides to declare an Ecological Emergency.
- (ii) Supports the Climate and Ecological Emergency Bill.
- (iii) Keynsham Town Council informs the local media of this decision.
- (iv) Keynsham Town Council writes to their local MPs, asking them to support the Bill.
- (v) Keynsham Town Council write to CEE Bill Alliance, the organisers of the campaign for the Bill expressing its support (campaign@ceebill.uk)
