### 109. HERITAGE OPEN DAYS 2026

Report received from Amanda Leonard, the Business and Community Engagement Officer, on the plans to date for the Heritage Open Days 2026.

Richard Dyson will be including his guided walking tour and a separate talk on the History of Keynsham. Richard will also provide some history on various locations in Keynsham for the event programme.

Keynsham Snap and Stroll are keen to put on an exhibition on Keynsham Past and Present.

St John's will be putting on tower tours and guided Church tours, as well as Bell Ringing. Voluntary donations are permitted at the event, but the event must be free to the public.

The Rachel Shaw Collection of Roman Artefacts will be on show, and the Library have confirmed that they will provide someone to talk through them.

Cllr Biddleston confirmed that there are lots more Roman Artefacts that are in B&NES storage and are rarely displayed. Martin Woodward added that he has spoken to Heritage team in B&NES and they have confirmed that they are considering displaying the Artefacts.

Amanda continued that Allen Richards from KTC will be down at the Cemetery showing people around and that the Albert Mill will also be opened again.

Cllr Biddleston spoke about how, as part of the Music Festival, the performance of a Bridge across the Flood, was reprised. There was another performance of the Keynsham Workhouse. He would like to suggest that the Copyright be purchased by the Town Council.

Amanda reported that there has been a discussion with Ric about bringing back the performance of the Bonzo Dog Doo-Dah Band as part of the Heritage event. There are costs involved in this and as the event need to be free for the Heritage Open Days these would need to be covered. It could be a ticketed event and cover costs, but this would have to run alongside our Heritage Open Days events, with a brief mention of it in the programme but not one of the official events.

Martin Woodward reported on various things that are happening at St John's Church. A group at the Church are in the process of reordering the Church to make it more of an exhibition space, replacing the doors with glass doors, installing a servery and toilets to make it a welcoming and useable space. They are looking for ways of funding this, in particular looking at National Lottery funding and Heritage Fund, so looking to place the history of St John's Church within the context of the whole of Keynsham as it has a fantastic history.

They have been speaking to Stuart Prior from Bristol University and the idea of carrying out ground penetrating radar around the Church, The Paddock, the car parks, and nearby gardens and maybe the Abbey site to get a new picture and look at how to share our history. He has had a meeting with Dawn Dury and Alan Jenner about The Paddock, which was part of the Abbey. The University are willing to carry out the ground penetrating radar for free, and they are also willing, over a three-year period, to carry out some excavation digs.

Spoken to B&NES who are keen for a semi-permanent or permanent display. St John's are keen to "Green up" the grounds, with display boards with information about the history, this would include The Paddock. They are also in talks with the local Schools, Bath Spa University and Bristol University to help raise the profile of Keynsham.
